Notes and requests from Clare:

I will be opening a new waiting list in time for the new school term on Monday 5th January. Until then please keep knitting/crocheting/sewing items for us because we want to be able to hit the ground running when the new list opens. If we can build up a stock before the list opens it means that therapists don't have nearly so long to wait after they put in a request.

I am taking a short break over Christmas and so I would ask that you try to post items by:

Last posting date before Christmas......15th December

After which, please wait to post your items until:

First posting date after New Year.....2nd January

- For each new waiting list I decided that we would only take a maximum of 200 orders at a time, and this has worked well, putting us (and me!) under far less pressure than last time when we allowed nearly 2,000 before closing the list. It will mean that we open our list much more often. We completed in three months the 200 orders which we received back in September, and that is a great rate of progress. Huge thanks to you! You are the ones who make all this possible, and I'm constantly amazed and delighted at your generosity in donating your materials, your time, your skills and the postage, and all in order to help children.
- I think it's fair to say that we all feel how deeply sad it is to find that so many children need help, but how satisfying it is to know that we can do our bit. The therapists are always over the moon, and we have lots of new feedback starting on page 16 which underlines that. So please keep the items coming.
- SAFETY EYES: we absolutely love safety eyes, so please continue to use them if you wish, however just recently there have been a spate of cases where the eyes hadn't fully locked onto their backings and were easily able to be pulled out during safety tests. It's incredibly hard sometimes to get them to fully engage, you have to have superhuman strength! But it's really worth it for the fantastic result that they give. Thanks goes to Carole W who has recommended buying a "Safety Eye Insertion Tool". There are various ones available online. Who knew??!

• PANTS! At the moment I don't need extra pants thanks, we have a good stock, but it is great if you can knit your own for your own item (totally optional though!). And please could you either make them a plain colour, or if you want to use up oddments and make the pants stripy that's fine, but if you wish you could you make the lower half of your monster (below the waist) plain coloured – a flesh tone would be ideal if poss. This differentiates the pants from the monster body, which is helpful. Knitters new to KfN may not know that the pants are used by therapists to illustrate the NSPCC "Pants Programme" – see their website.



• FOR THE TIME BEING – WE NOW HAVE ENOUGH BODY IMAGE PAIRS (unless I've contacted you individually). The ones you've sent in will all be donated but as not every therapist needs these, they don't go into every box, and it would be best if you transfer your skills to other items please. I'll let you know when we need more again, thanks.

- Please tie your puppet sets together the tie will be removed before donation, so any tie is fine. It helps me a lot and makes it quicker at this end, thanks

THE IDEAL NOTE INSIDE YOUR PARCEL

NEW! THE COUNTY YOU LIVE IN

Could I ask that all makers include their county on their note please? Even if you are a regular contributor, I often can't remember your county, which means that before labelling your items I have to look it up – this all takes time and it will make things much quicker and simpler if you could include it on your note, thank you. Just to tell those makers whe are new to KfN, I always label your item with your first name (never surname for confidentiality) and county. Many therapists have said how much they liked to see that personal touch.

- PLEASE ALWAYS INCLUDE YOUR SURNAME: I need to find you on the database for stock
 records etc. and my computer won't find you if you only put your first name! I have a
 memory like a sieve for surnames, and with over 5,000 contacts on my system there may be
 many others with the same first name. (By the way, that doesn't mean we have 5,000
 knitters, far from it, it's mostly therapists who have been supplied or are waiting.)
- EMAIL ADDRESS also helps me find you on the system
- STUFFING TYPE USED: I ONLY NEED THE TRADE NAME eg. Habico, Trimits, Hollowfill, Hobbycraft etc. Please remember to put this on your note. Otherwise, in order not to invalidate my insurance, I need to ask you each time, (even if you've told me previously that you have a large stock of stuffing and will let me know if/when that type changes).



WE'D LIKE MORE OF THE FOLLOWING PLEASE!

MORE BULLIES AND GROOMERS PLEASE! We never have enough. They are easy to knit and the faces aren't difficult to embroider. If you could add a couple in with your other items that would really help, or maybe consider doing a batch of them?



MORE EMOTICOLOUR PUPPET SETS PLEASE! Some knitters have told me that they take ages to make and there is a lot of sewing up, but these are so important to the therapists and I am always having to ration them. They do take time, but the end result is so amazing that you'll be so pleased with what you've done! We do need them to be in complete sets though, not singles thanks. Would you like to collaborate with another knitter? (Sadly Val will not be able to help for the next three months as she'll be visiting her family in Australia). If you do fancy making just half a set please let me know and I'll try to pair you with someone else, making it much easier to complete one set.



COULD ANYONE VOLUNTEER TO MAKE US A BATCH OF PREGNANT PUPPETS PLEASE? As many as you like so that I can add one into boxes going to Psychologists and Play Therapists. I have had feedback from them that the pregnant puppets are extremely useful. There is a pattern for them on the website "Patterns for Hand Puppets" page – to find it just scroll down below the Muslim set. The bump on these can be on one side or both, it's your choice – both are useful.



Pregnant monsters – we have a pattern for these or simply add more stuffing to the tummy



Professionals sets – unfortunately many children will come across these characters in the course of their therapy, and at the moment we are having to ration them because we never receive enough sets to go around. We need the full set, not individuals please.



NEW PATTERN: "AGGRESSOR AND VICTIM"

We were asked by a therapist working with cases of abuse if we could make an "Aggressor and victim" pair of puppets. So Val has adapted the Shouty/Pouty pair with a very similar pattern. IT'S COMING SOON! Keep your eye on the website and when it's been test knitted it will appear on the "Hand Puppet Animals" Page.



AND SEWERS! PATTERN FOR SEWN PROFESSIONALS HAND PUPPETS!

There is now a pattern on the website for all the sewn professionals, kindly donated by Chris in Hampshire



We think that Penny in North Yorkshire should win our "imaginary" prize for the most amazing hair on a monster EVER! Each piece of yarn is individually inserted -must have taken hours. Thank you Penny for such a fantastic result!



And please feel free to use your creativity to vary the hair/head additions like Rachel and Mel have done (below). Whilst sticking to our patterns (as they've been very carefully thought out taking into account the needs of the therapists) it's fine to add your own touches if it adds play value.



CASE STUDY

How the items you make help in therapy, by a Play Therapist

Jamie was 5 when he arrived at the domestic abuse refuge. He and his family had fled domestic abuse from his father. Jamie had left behind everything that was familiar to him, everything that he loved including his friends, his bedroom and his favourite toys.

Jamie had witnessed severe domestic abuse from his father to his mum. He had seen his father push his mum over, he had heard him calling her horrible names and he had comforted his mother all too often when she was in tears.

In Jamie's eyes you communicate with your family by hurting them, by making them cry and as the male of the family you are in charge.

Jamie didn't know any different. Jamie didn't know right from wrong, in his world this behaviour was 'normal'.

Jamie was displaying challenging behaviour on arrival including shouting and swearing at his mum and siblings. He was also self-harming by scratching himself when frustrated and banging his head off the walls/doors.

As a Play Therapist I soon realised that Jamie wasn't always able to tell me what it was that was making him feel so cross, he didn't understand why now people were telling him that it was not ok to shout at his mum and that he should be listening to what his mum asks him to do.

Jamie started an intensive course of play therapy in which he used the therapeutic mediums available to him to 'play out' the difficult scenarios that he had witnessed between his mum and dad. Play is a child's natural form of communication so for Jamie it didn't matter that he couldn't make sense of it or put into words what he was trying to express, he didn't have to. He was accepted for who he was and what he was displaying without judgement. Jamie now had a safe place to explore and start to try and understand what had happened to him in his short life.

Jamie used large puppet heads and would fight with them in the playroom, he also regularly used figurines to act out the behaviour that he had seen his father displaying to his mum. The father would always play the 'baddy' in his play. The 'baddy' would be hurting the other character or shouting and swearing at them. The 'baddy' would be telling the female character what to do and making threats of what would happen if she didn't do this.

Jamie began to process and make sense of the difficulties experienced and his behaviour began to change. He became calmer and was now able to voice his frustrations telling his mum what was making him feel so cross instead of hurting himself.

After 10 play therapy sessions Jamie no longer needed to be in therapy and his family relationships with his mum and siblings had improved.

WHAT YOU SAY ABOUT KFN

- That request you kindly enclosed really brings home that by sitting, knitting, crochet and sewing we can do our bit to help. What more incentive do we need to keep our needles clacking (and stash enhancing .).

 With Christmas approaching it does make you reflect that some of the children Knit-for-Nowt support may not be having such a happy time, so I hope that Caramel the cat can bring comfort and joy to someone. I think he would like some hugs too!

SOME SAD FACTS re. CHILD POVERTY

Research carried out by the charity Action for Children gives us a bleak picture of why many children have such severe worries and behavioural problems and need our items to help heal them:

- 4.2 million children live in families that can't save at least £10 a month
- 2.7 million have parents who can't replace broken essential electrical goods such as a fridge or washing machine
- 1.2 million have parents who can't keep up with bills
- 800,000 whose parents can't afford to keep the house warm
- 300,000 children in families that can't afford to eat fresh fruit or vegetables each day
- 200,000 children are in families that can't afford to go to a playgroup once a week, or to celebrate on special occasions
- a third of children aged 8 to eighteen fear that a friend or classmate won't get any presents or celebrate Christmas this year because their family can't afford it.
- one in five UK children 2.6 million are materially deprived, meaning their families can't afford the basic items and activities that the Government considers essential to a happy and healthy childhood. Of these, more than half - 1.5 million - are under 10 years old.



WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP

We'd like to ask if you'd PLEASE DO THE FOLLOWING SAFETY CHECKS ON YOUR ITEMS

You all make the most incredible items and for the vast majority of the time they are super safe, thank you for the checks you already make on them. This checklist might help to reassure you that you've checked over all aspects of your item, as it's so easy to forget one or two of them! We've all done it! All items are safety checked again before being sent out.

- Have I used an approved stuffing? Check the recommended stuffings document you were sent, or if you haven't received that then please contact Clare
- Have I left any pins in? It's best to use the larger headed pins but even these can become lost in the knitting
- Are all the attachments nice and firm? Pull strongly on all attachments, including any buttons – really pull! They must be absolutely secure and unable to be pulled out by a small child. Secure again anything you're not happy with



- Is the hair secure? Between first finger and thumb pull on each and every strand of yarn attached to ensure that none can be pulled out by a small child
- Have I left any holes in my work? Check your item for holes in the stitching where stuffing could be seen through. In particular this can happen at the top of the head on a monster/animal, or at the sides of the mouth pocket/mouth and where you increased the stitches. If you find any holes please sew them up!
- Is anything too long? Check that any choking hazards such as ropes, strands, ribbons, yarn, or lengths of arms/legs are no longer than a maximum of 9" (not counting feet or hands)
- Ooh, what's that pong??! Has my darling pet been lying on my work?? Have a good sniff!
 Ensure there are no strong odours which might affect asthma/allergy these can include
 cooking smells, smoke, pets or even strong disinfectant. If the odour is strong please don't
 use washing powder/fabric freshener but instead rinse in fresh water and/or hang out on
 the line. And please check for dog/cat hairs on your work

WHAT STUFFING SHOULD I USE?

- Makers quite rightly are concerned to use the correct, approved stuffing in their monsters and/or puppets' heads, but it's often difficult to tell online whether stuffings are really suitable. The old CE label has become the UKCA label after our leaving the EU, and there are various different BS markings covering flammability and cleanliness/toxicity all very confusing! When posting items, please confirm which stuffing you have used.
- Many stuffings online have the fire safety numbers but not the hygiene ones. Please don't
 use these even if they say they are safe for toys.
- The following are at present, (@ December 2025), available online and are approved for our items. You may use others which you find with the correct markings, but these must first be sanctioned by us. We'll need the full maker's name and the link where you buy it.





But please bear in mind that all these can be purchased from various different manufacturers, so you might want to shop around a bit. Please always look for the picture of the bag, with the BS numbers on it. All of the above have the correct markings. The stuffing you use should have the following on the bag

• BS5852 (fire safety) BS1425 (cleanliness), and/or EN71 or BS 5665

SUMMARY OF ITEMS NEEDED

- 1 Worry monsters Choose from "Zippy" (has a zipped mouth) or "Toothy the Worry Eater". Sewn ones welcome too. Note the recommended dimensions in the patterns and please stuff these firmly with approved stuffing. Please make a nice deep pocket
- 2 Animal Worry Eaters or Robot worry eaters please ensure that you make a really good, deep pocket and please stuff these firmly with approved stuffing
- 3 Sewn Mojo monsters the knitted version didn't prove so popular, but the sewn version is just about the most popular item requested. Please stuff these firmly
- 4 "Body Image" worry monsters, both in knitted and sewn versions, identical in height and colours, but one is fatter, one thinner. NB. December 2025 just for the moment we don't need these thanks (unless you've been contacted individually)
- 5 Disability monsters if only one leg or arm, please make a stump, it looks more realistic. No disability animals thanks
- Abuse monsters simply add a crescent shape around one eye, (black eye), and some purple, red or black marks on the limbs by sewing on pieces of felt, knitting or embroidering them. No abuse animals thanks
- Pants for monsters if you send a set of them we can fit them on the monsters here, or you could make your own for your monster. NB. December 2025 no extra ones needed thanks
- 8 Hand puppet families with happy/sad sides Mum, Dad, Gran, Grandad, boy, girl, with siblings if you like. With faces in cream or pale pink yarn, or any shade of brown, but not black. Please make them all to fit an adult hand, including the boy and girl
- 9 Hand puppet families as above, but specifically Muslim or Asian
- 10 Bully hand puppet and Internet groomer hand puppet
- 11 Pairs of identical hand puppets for Play Therapy work these could be "people" or animals
- "Professionals" sets of hand puppets: doctor, nurse, police, social worker, teacher, judge in robes, "professional in a suit"
- "Emotiknit Colour Puppets Set": our very own pattern different colours represent different emotions. Not single ones thanks, we need the whole set
- Animal or children's character hand puppets feel free to use patterns available online. As it's for charity we've never had a problem with that, but we're unable to put them up on the website due to copyright
- 15 Transgender hand puppets (one side male, one side female)
- 16 Finger puppets use any pattern you like, they can be people or animals
- 17 Pregnant monster and pregnant hand puppet
